**Something to think about as we (Good Hope) embark on a New Beginning....
A Message from David Wolfe, Youth & Family Ministry Coordinator**

We are not alone. Many congregations are struggling with fewer pastors, churches with part-time leadership, older congregations, finances, forgetting our mission, and burnout of those who feel responsible for doing everything.

I attended a workshop while I was at this year's Extravaganza in Anaheim, California. The workshop was titled *Practicing Change: Growing Young* and it showed me/us a new way of changing congregations into Jesus-Centered Communities. Rachel Alley conducted this workshop. She spoke of 6 Commitments to growing young, and I thought I'd share them with you:

1. Keychain Leadership: Instead of centralizing authority, empower others, especially young people.
2. Empathy Today: Instead of judging or criticizing, step into the shoes of our young people's generation.
3. Jesus' Message: Instead of asserting formulaic gospel claims, welcome young people into a Jesus-centered way of life.
4. Warm Relationships: Instead of focusing on cool worship or programs, aim for warm peer and intergenerational friendship.
5. Prioritize Everything: Instead of giving lip service to how much young people matter, look for creative ways to tangibly support, resource, and involve them in all facets of your congregation.
6. Best Neighbors: Instead of condemning the world outside your walls, enable young people to neighbor well locally and globally.

The Good News is, our congregation is currently doing many of these Commitments. I can think of a dozen ways we are meeting these commitments with our young people. However, we can always do better. While a few of our young people have welcomed the opportunities that our congregation has provided for them, the reality of it all is that there have been only a few. We need to do better. It's like we should become a church with a mission for transition. There is so much more that could be done. I pray that our congregation can grow young, not only by the average age of our congregation but also by the relationship we share towards one another. Jesus is counting on us!

Dear Good Hope Family,

Giving is a personal choice, a matter of conscience directed by the teaching of Jesus. Some are in need. God has blessed us beyond need so we choose to give where help is needed. Giving is a blessing in and of itself as it feels good and makes our hearts joyful. We want Good Hope Lutheran Church, the ELCA, and Christianity in general to stay strong to carry out God's message of redemption through Jesus Christ; so we give.

There are basically three ways to give: give of time; give of talents; give of money. As we both taught school and Elwood always had summer work, and we lived rather simply, we have always been able and willing to support Good Hope and many other charities and individuals financially.

The categories of time and talents are hard to separate. Over the years we worked with the Sunday school as superintendent (both) and teacher (Sarah). In leadership roles, Elwood served as president of the congregation and Sarah as president of WELCA for many years. Sarah loves to sing in the two choirs and even tried ringing the bells. Elwood ushers. Elwood is a member of the Finance Committee and Sarah gives home communion to several ladies. Elwood is power of attorney to a Good Hope member and takes him to church each Sunday. Both Sarah and Elwood have transported people to doctors' appointments.

Elwood likes to work with his hands and has helped with many projects around the church building as he serves on the Property Care Committee. He has painted many areas of the building and built a wall in the room under the sanctuary to contain the moisture. Windows were framed in that room. In the sanctuary, pews have been repaired and a platform was built to level the organ. The preschool got a puppet theater, a storage box and safety rails for the risers. If you look to the front of the sanctuary where there were once round stained- glass windows, you will see replicas of their frames. These are made of layers of Styrofoam! Elwood made these in our garage when the sanctuary was last remodeled. He considers this his greatest project at Good Hope.

Sarah gives of time and talents by organizing the projects and meetings of WELCA, and currently as president of the Southeastern Conference, and its events too. She chairs the funeral lunch committee the first six months of the year, holds monthly meetings with WELCA Board, makes sure the items for Lutheran World Relief kits are purchased, reports in the "Steeplenotes" and chooses the designs of cards sent to members from WELCA.

When a call comes from Good Hope, we answer not just the phone, but whenever possible the need to which the call pertains, often putting aside our own scheduled business to help elsewhere. Why? God told us to!

Larry Shutler called the meeting to order with these members present: Larry Shutler, Doug Rossman, Doug Foght, Mark Milheim, Gary Auck, Joyce Schifer, Lydia Sullivan, Kristi Weber, Bettie Luidhardt, Jim Metcalf, Randy Fischer, David Wolfe. David Wolfe led council with prayer.

Communications: Good Hope received the following communications.

- Thank you from LOMO, Luther Home of Mercy, Lutheran Social Services.

Old Business:

- Budget - A motion was made by Randy Fischer to approve the 2020 budget. Seconded by Doug Foght. Motion passed.
- Stained Glass Windows - the balance owed on the Stained Glass Windows is now approximately \$65,000.00. A motion was made by Doug Foght to postpone the replacement of the North and East storm windows until the current balance of the loan is paid off. Seconded by Joyce Schifer. Motion passed.

New Business:

- Larry is now working with Sarah Schaaf and Sherry Krieger along with Pastor Ed Hunker in search of an Interim Pastor and substitute pastors. Sarah is the Dean of Southeastern Conference. She has also been an instructor for *Diakonia* since it began in NWOS in 2015. *Diakonia* is a lay education program. Sherry is the Director of Leadership Development for Congregational Care. Larry has Scott Fishpaw scheduled to preach on Sunday, Jan 26 and Dave Wolfe is scheduled for Ash Wednesday.
- A motion was made by Randy Fischer to have the office print the covers in black and white for the annual report. Seconded by Jim Metcalf. Motion passed.
- Randy Fischer informed the council that he is on the 2020 Bucyrus Bicentennial Committee. There are several activities being planned, including a Religious Heritage Day. He was hoping that Good Hope may be able to host some of the day's activities. More details will be discussed at a later date.
- Reminder-Council Installation will be held January 26 at both services. Please plan to attend one of the services.
- Reminder-Annual meeting will be Sunday, February 9 between services.

Committee Reports:

- **Preschool:** The new parenting class will begin Monday January 27. It will be on how to deal with disobedience. February 16 will be Thank You Sunday. Charla is working on registration for Preschool next year.
- **Property Care:** Munz Pirstill's insurance paid to have the East Alley Door replaced. Tom Etsinger is acting as Interim Custodian, so please thank Tom for helping out. The committee is tracking his hours.
- **Finance:** \$15,000.00 was taken from the Linser-Beers Fund and applied to the Stained Glass Window project. Statements of giving went out. They are continuing to work with John Bean consolidating accounts. Brokerage accounts ended in pretty good shape, partly because of a good stock market in 2019 and partly because of Bequest. They will make sure that memorials from funerals and bequest are receiving thank you cards.

Committee Reports:

- **Youth:** The youth are taking sub orders for the Super Bowl. First Communion classes will start March 1. There should be four or five children. The youth would like to do a noisy offering before the end of February for the World Vision Famine Lock-In.
- **Worship/Music:** They have been working on the Easter and Lenten Services. For some of the services they plan to have ministers, but for some of the Lenten services they may try something different, such as skits. On Easter, there will be only two services, 8:30 and 10:45. The first service will have the blended feel and be considered the Sunrise service.
 The Committee is working with Diane Rossman to update the Altar Guild committee. The organ reservoir has been taken out. To repair it would be very expensive. They have a used one that could be used. It should last another 30-40 years. It would have a ten year guarantee. It would save us about \$1,000.00.
- A discussion was held on possibly replacing some of the back pews with rocking chairs. These would be mostly for older people or mothers with young children. Some of the other churches are using them. Property care will look into it. Randy Fischer thanked the Worship/Music Committee for doing a great job for the Christmas Eve services.
- **Other reports:** Were as submitted to the office

Adjournment-A motion was made by Doug Rossman to adjourn. Seconded by Doug Focht. Motion passed. Larry led the council in the Lord's Prayer.
