TEMPLE TALK WITH PASTOR TANYCE

Dear Friends in Christ,

Hebrews 4:16: "Let us therefore approach the throne of grace with boldness, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need..."

GRACE IS...

In September, we focused on God's mercy. Mercy is not receiving what we deserve. In October, grace is our focus. Grace is receiving what we do not deserve. God sees each of us exactly as we are and pours grace upon us. In our baptism we are washed clean, renewed, marked with the cross of Christ, and sealed by the Holy Spirit.

The Hebrews 4:16 verse encourages us to approach the throne of grace with boldness, trusting in the unconditional love and forgiveness of our Savior, Jesus Christ. The familiar hymn uses the word "amazing" to describe this grace because it is ours to embrace and accept. Saved by grace through faith!

Martin Luther said, "Faith is a living, daring confidence in God's **grace**, so sure and certain that a man could stake his life on it a thousand times."

Webster's New World College Dictionary provides this theological definition of grace: "The unmerited love and favor of God toward human beings; divine influence acting in a person to make the person pure, morally strong; the condition of a person brought to God's favor through this influence; a special virtue, gift, or help given to a person by God."

Grace, which comes from the Greek New Testament word *charis*, is God's unmerited favor. It is kindness from God that we don't deserve. There is nothing we have done, nor can ever do to earn this favor. It is a gift from God.

God's Work, Our Hands...Practicing the Discipleship of Grace & Mercy

God's Work, Our Hands, continues at Good Hope. This month, we are encouraging each other to practice the discipleship of grace and mercy, opening our eyes to seek ways we can show mercy everyday in our lives at work, at school, at home, at church. The "Jacob's Ladder" is there to remind you that all good and perfect gifts are from above, shining down from the Father in heavenly lights, never shifting in the shadows. Letter Announcing Retirement of David Wolfe, Youth and Family Minister Coordinator

September 2, 2021

Good Hope Lutheran Church:

In the Book of Ecclesiastes, King Solomon wrote, there is a time for everything, and a season for every purpose under heaven.

a time to embrace and a time to refrain,
a time to search and a time to give up,
a time to keep and a time to let go,
a time to tear and a time to mend,

For a long time I've come to believe that a ministry should not be perceived as the property of any one person. That in time that person should step aside to allow someone else to use their gifts for that ministry. It is at this time that I want to tell you all my desire to transfer my duties here at Good Hope from one of Youth & Family Ministry Coordinator to that of ordinary member of this church family. I'm announcing that December 31, 2021 will be my last day as an employee of Good Hope. I want you to know that my decision to retire is not a spur of the moment reaction to anything. - ♥ 50 health kits each with a bath towel, a comb, 2 bars of soap, a toothbrush, and nail clippers

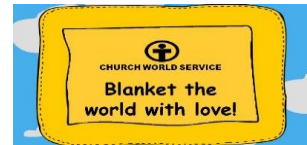
Items for these kits are purchased with offerings on Maundy Thursday. Some money for postage was sent to LWR from these offerings also.

The WELCA Northwestern Synodical Convention was held at Archbold, Ohio September 10 and 11.

- ♥ The theme of the convention was centered around the life of Esther, who was used by God to save the lives of the Jewish people. Pastor Sarah Schaaf and Pastor Lori Strong presented studies on the Book of Esther; Maggie Everett portrayed Esther, telling the story of her life.
- ♥ A silent auction of donated "baskets" was held to help pay for representatives to attend the next national convention.
- ♥ A quartet entertained at the Friday evening banquet and a Purim Party was held during our Saturday lunch.
- ♥ Those who attended, including Bettie, Roberta, and Sarah from Good Hope, took items to give to Pastor Lori's church, Redeemer Lutheran in Toledo, where only about twenty worship on a Sunday, but spend many hours and much money caring for the neighbors surrounding the church. This includes an eight-week summer program providing a safe space for children, a food pantry, and other outreach ministries.
- ♥ During the convention we heard from a churchwide representative; one of only two persons along with only six part-time employees doing all the work for the national WELCA. She spoke of all that had been accomplished in a year even though the staff had been cut to just a few employees.
- ♥ You may be interested to learn that Good Hope is one of the few congregations in our synod that have a Thankoffering Sunday (coming up in November) to support our national organization. We're also one of the few that send in regular offerings to our synod. Those offerings have dwindled in the last few years as they are what is given at circle meetings and very few of our ladies attend those. The ladies who are active at all levels of WELCA try to keep the ministry alive and functioning well, but fewer and fewer ladies seem interested in the work of WELCA.

Communion: Kay Kimerline will be calling people to help.

Approval of Minutes- Gary Auck moved to approve the June council minutes. Seconded by Joyce Schifer. Motion passed.

Communications:

- A thank you was received from the Salvation Army for the donation of socks to their clothing pantry.

Old Business:

- The float received Best Float in the Bicentennial parade but was not in the Bratwurst Festival Parade.
- Carson Herschler is the new custodian. He is doing a great job. If you see him, please say Hi and welcome him.
- The office air conditioner should be in by the end of September.
- Preschool starts on Monday.

New Business:

- The Synod Assembly will be held virtually on Friday, September 24th from 6:00 - 8:30pm. Two delegates are needed.
On motion by Doug Foght and seconded by Doug Rossman at least two members of the Fischer family will be the delegates. Motion passed.
- The council will be losing three members. The term is up for Doug Foght, Doug Rossman, and Lydia Sullivan. Two of them also serve on Property Care. The council needs to start thinking about replacements.
- The Healthy Congregation workshop will be held on Tuesday, September 21st from 5:30 to 8:30pm.
- The God's Work, Our Hands project will begin September 5th. The themes for September, October, and November are Mercy, Grace, and Peace. There will be two services. The 8:30 service will be more blended, and the 10:45 service will be traditional. There will be an opportunity wall. Everyone will have a chance to walk by the wall and choose someone to pray for or some other service project to do. The next week, they can post pictures or a story of what they did. Because we no longer have WOW, we are looking for other small projects. Some ideas are distributing diapers, cookies, messages, or flowers, adopting a street, donating to the humane society. If anyone has any suggestions, contact Outreach.
- Pastor Tanyce introduced a new form that Carol put together for committee minutes. It should help make the minutes from each committee meeting more uniform.

- COVID-Covid cases are now at its highest since January. Carson will be spraying the sanctuary between services. The council members brainstormed about what can be done to protect church members. - Preschool-Everything is ready to go for preschool to start Monday, August 30th. Parent orientation is being held August 26th. Lauren Auck is the new preschool assistant.

Staff Reports:

Pastor Tanyce : She has received full endorsement by the Synod. She will enter into a full internship from Oct 1 through May. She has had a busy couple of months. The rest of her report is as submitted.

David Wolf (Youth and Family Ministry Coordinator): The Fall into Lakeside event scheduled for fall is up in the air at this time. It may be live, virtual, or postponed. He still plans to proceed with the Empty Bowl project. The youth made almost \$1,000.00 from the Bratwurst parking lot. This would normally go towards the National Youth Gathering. Instead of the youth going to the National Youth Gathering, which is scheduled to be held in Minneapolis, an alternative mission trip may be planned. The rest of the report is as submitted.

In addition to the Parish Ed report submitted, David Wolfe reported that VBS went very well. It was held on Sunday and Monday night for three weeks. He got a lot of positive feedback.

Committee Reports: Committee reports were all as submitted.

Next Meeting will be held September 23rd, and then November 18th, and December 16th.
