## TEMPLE TALK WITH PASTOR TANYCE

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

I am writing this while I am in my intensive week of seminary classes. These weeks are filled with vibrant conversations and insights. We begin every morning with worship. The classes are structured so perfectly layered to lead us into greater understanding, stronger skills, and deep gratitude for the almighty and powerful Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. Amen.

### NOVEMBER WORSHIP EXPERIENCES

November brings to the church calendar beautiful worship experiences. We begin on November 7 with All Saints Day, remembering and honoring those Saints who have entered into the Church Triumphant. Candles will be lighted during the worship by family members representing God's everlasting promise of eternal life and light. Your love and support to each other in the Body of Christ is important. Mark this on your calendars as a worship where your presence is definitely requested to uplift, to sing strongly the hymn, "For All the Saints".

We think of Thanksgiving this month. On November 14th, we will give thanks for the blessings God has bestowed upon us. I encourage you to take those pumpkins you may have setting around and write on them a blessing that you experience and give God the glory for. You will need many pumpkins. Fill your hearts with the spirit of gratitude and service. We will have many opportunities for giving. Stay tuned!

On November 21st, it is Christ the King Sunday, the last Sunday in the Liturgical (church) year. I have now experienced an entire church year with all of you. To walk the weeks with you through the life of Christ, the stories of Jesus' teaching in the Bible, to share the joy and sufferings with the Theology of the Cross brings such peace to us all. God's peace that surpasses all understanding. That is why November is our Good Hope Theme of PEACE.

I am including an article for [gotquestions.org](http://gotquestions.org) that I invite you to read and to study:

### WHAT IS THE PEACE THAT PASSES UNDERSTANDING?

In [Philippians 4:7](#) We have a wonderful promise: "The peace of God, which passes all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus." It is important to note the context of this promise, because that's where we find the condition: "Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God" (verse 6). God's peace is promised to guard those who pray—with thanksgiving—about everything. This peace will transcend our ability to understand it.

There are other gifts of God that are not fully comprehensible to us. The gift of salvation is "indescribable" ([2 Corinthians 9:15](#)). The complexity and wisdom of God's plan is inscrutable ([Isaiah 55:8-9](#)). According to [Ephesians 3:19](#), the love of Christ is something else so great we will never fully understand it. Likewise, human reasoning is incapable of fully comprehending the peace of God.

The believer who places his or her full confidence in a loving God and is thankful in every circumstance will possess a supernatural peace. An inner calm will dominate the heart. The faithful believer will know peace—his heart and mind are "guarded" by it—despite the tempest raging without. No one, especially those outside of Christ, will be able to fathom that peace. To most, it will remain a mystery how someone can be so serene in the midst of turmoil.

The peace that comes from being in a right relationship with God is not the peace of this world. The world's peace depends on having favorable circumstances: if things are going well, then we feel peaceful; when things go awry, the peace quickly dissipates. Jesus made the distinction between His peace and the world's vacillating peace: "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives" (John 14:27).

God's supernatural peace surpasses natural understanding. A cancer patient who experiences a remission of the disease may proclaim, "I am so thankful to God!" That is praise. A cancer patient who is dying and in pain may calmly say, "Everything is alright. I claim Romans 8:28, and I have peace in my heart." That is "the peace that passes all understanding."

**PUTTING GOD FIRST**

As your pastoral leader, I ask you to make time this month of Thanksgiving, to put God first in your day, your week, this entire month. Create time for "God Talk". Pray before meals with your family. Only speak words of gratitude. Live as children of God knowing the joy that being a child of God brings!

May we seek God's peace together. Amen.

Randy Fischer called the meeting to order. **Members Present**-Randy Fischer, Gary Auck, Doug Rossman, Doug Foght, Joyce Schifer, Linda Bean, Lydia Sullivan, Nancy Heiby, Melinda Crall-Cauley, Maggy Everett, David Wolfe, and Pastor Tanyce.

**Approval of Minutes:** After amending the minutes from the August 26th meeting to include Lori Burkhart as a delegate for the Synod Assembly, Linda Bean moved to approve the minutes, seconded by Joyce Schifer. Motion passed.

A special Congregational Council Meeting was held on September 2, 2021. Joyce Schifer moved to approve the minutes of that meeting, seconded by Doug Rossman. Motion passed

**Communications:** None

### **Old Business:**

- The Council is still looking for three new members. Please let Randy Fischer know of any names by the October Council meeting.
- The Healthy Congregation Council workshop was moved from September 23<sup>rd</sup> to September 30<sup>th</sup>. The topic of this workshop is Stewardship. The purpose of the workshops is to help build healthy leaders in the Church. Please let David Wolfe know if you will be attending.
- Pastor Tanyce talked about the Gods Work Our Hands project. She would like everyone on the council to come up with ideas of ways people can serve. Put the ideas on cards and then they can be posted on the opportunity wall. People can pick up the card and then do what it says. It can be as simple as taking out the trash, buying some school supplies, or saying a prayer.

### **New Business:**

- The church would like volunteers to help Carson clean out the balcony.
- A new location for the banners that are on the balcony was discussed. We could store them in the closet, or possibly hang some of them from the balcony. Pastor Tanyce will look into the banner situation and see what can be done.
- It was also suggested that the auditorium would look better if the chairs matched the tables. Doug Foght will look into the cost of the chairs.
- COVID update: Communion has been doing well with the congregation taking it back to their seat. A sign has been posted outside the sanctuary regarding the recommendation of wearing mask. Most people continue to social distance. The fans are being run continuously to help with air flow circulation. It was suggested that a table be moved outside the sanctuary for worship registration. It was also discussed whether the choir should wear mask when singing. At this time, it will be up to each individual.
- A committee has been formed to help find a replacement for David Wolfe. The committee members are Melinda Crall-Cauley, Jeremy Shull, Jim Scott, Susan Holdcraft, Nancy Fischer, Erin and Matt Weber, Traci Wetterau, and Brittany Crall.
- Children and other individuals have been getting underneath the steps in the back of the church. Property care will be putting a fence around the area.
- Bettie left a message that the Preschool will be starting popcorn sales on September 30<sup>th</sup>. Volunteers will be taking orders after the church services on Oct 3<sup>rd</sup> and Oct. 10<sup>th</sup>.
